

Driving Instructions

Please note that there are two sets of driving instructions, one for buses and one for passenger cars. Both routes will be clearly marked when you enter the campus. Please follow these directions. Google Maps may direct you to other routes which may not work because you may enter unloading zones in the wrong direction, or you may have to fight oncoming traffic.

Cars

Cars will be asked to **exit I-10 on Dalrymple Drive**. Cars will follow Dalrymple drive west to LSU. After crossing Highland Road, cars will **turn left on Tower Drive**. They will go straight and **drop off students on Tower Drive in front of the Memorial Tower**. After the drop off, cars will **veer left in front of the union and turn right at the intersection on to Highland Road. Follow Highland Road and turn right on South Quad Drive. Turn left at the nearest parking lot located along South Quad Drive south of campus**. You need about fifteen to twenty minutes on foot to return to the center of campus.

Buses

Buses are heavily discouraged from taking Dalrymple due to construction. Buses will use the **Acadian Throughway exit on I-10 and turn south towards Stanford Avenue. Follow Stanford Avenue**, passing the lakes and **turn right on West Lakeshore Drive. West Lakeshore becomes South Stadium Road. Follow South Stadium Road and drop students off in front of Tureaud Hall. Take the next left to Engineering Lane**. It will lead to South Quad Drive. **Cross South Quad Drive into the Touchdown Village parking lot.**

All testing locations are not far from the bus and car drop off points. We will have information points at strategic locations to help our visitors find their way. Please calculate about 20-30 minutes to get to your destination after you are dropped off. Please also take into consideration that your vehicle may stand in line for some time before students can be dropped off.

To better orient yourself on the LSU campus, download the FindMyClass App on your smartphone.

Please be aware that you will not have access to Wi-Fi on the LSU campus.
