### **District Rallies**

District Rallies went very well in all districts.

### Voting Items

Megan Stone called for nominations for the Executive Committee Vice President. Voting was postponed due to zero nominations being received.

Megan Stone proposed District Rally be held February 24, 2024, and State Rally be held March 23, 2023. Darden Gladney motioned to approve. The motion was seconded and carried.

### **Open Discussion**

The first item discussed was the possibility of adding African American Studies to the literary events. Members would like confirmation on whether or not adding African American Studies means that a different event is required to be omitted. It was suggested that we send a survey to all members to determine the number of schools offering African American Studies.

The second item discussed was dates for the 2025 District Rally and State Rally. While some members think holding the events early in the year are challenging because teachers do not yet know who to nominate and students may not have mastered the material yet, other members find earlier dates favorable as it's easier to avoid conflicts with spring athletic events primarily baseball. Some members posed the idea of holding District Rally and State Rally on a weekday to prevent conflicting with athletic events and to accommodate parents who work weekends. Megan Stone confirmed to the group that holding State Rally on a weekday on LSU's campus is not possible due to parking and room constraints plus it would be very difficult to recruit enough volunteers.

The time and location of the GAP meeting was cited as the predominant reason for the low attendance. Many principals travel with the students to State Rally and therefore had to travel back with them after the Literary Events. The general consensus is the GAP meeting should be held at the same time as the Literary Events and preferably at a central location on campus rather than at Lod Cook.

### Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 12:30.
